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## Strategic Planning Development Cycle

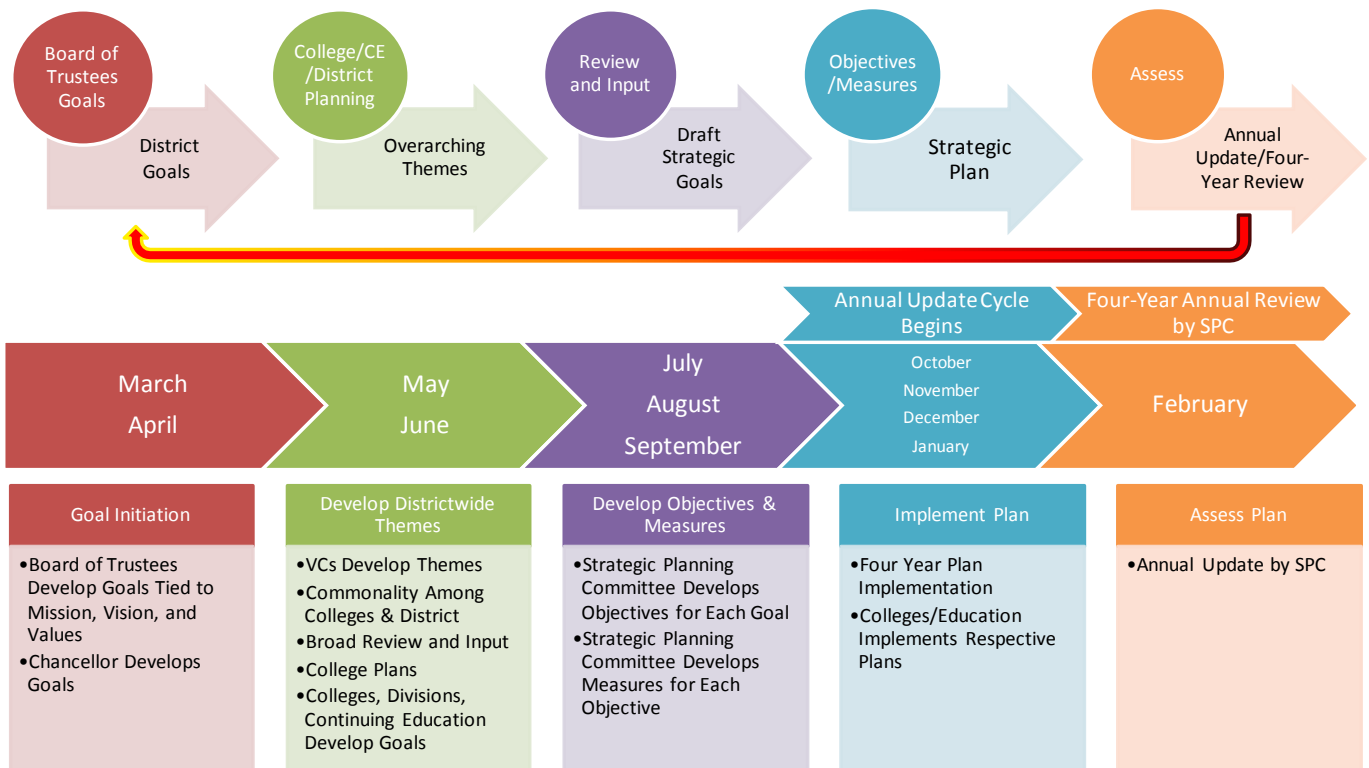
Districtwide Strategic Planning:

**Up-coming resources:** Plagiarism software (Vericite), Train the Trainer @ONE, Common Assessment, and Education Planning.

### 2. Use OEI Resources and Canvas

Currently, there are 84 colleges that have indicated their intent to move to Canvas.

### 3. Use OEI Resources, Canvas and the Exchange

The OEI has redefined the "Exchange." The college must use Canvas in order to participate in the Exchange. As a Teaching College, participation means that the college would be able to offer courses on the Exchange.

## OTC 2016

SDCCD Online Learning Pathways staff attended the OTC (Online Teaching Conference) held June 15 and 16. Held at the San Diego Convention Center, the OTC drew attendees from all across California. Conference presenters included Nancy Fredericks, Karen Lim, and Aileen Gum (SDCCD OLP Faculty Mentor) from City College, Robert Pickford from Mesa College, and Katie Palacios, SDCCD Online Learning Pathways Instructional Designer. The "take aways" from the conference were video and mobile connections in online learning and the tremendous progress they have made with the Online Education Initiative.



# Stand Alone Credit Course Approval

The Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges approved changes to Title 5, Section 55100 which will allow community college districts to approve stand-alone credit courses, without separate approval

from the state Chancellor's Office. This means the San Diego Community College District may approve and offer credit courses which are not part of an approved educational program. Although these courses



do not require separate approval from the state Chancellor's Office, local curriculum approval processes (Curriculum Review Committee (CRC), Curriculum Instructional Council (CIC), and Board of Trustees approval) and established curriculum deadlines still apply. Additionally, the State Chancellor's Office will conduct a periodic review to ensure that districts are in compliance with Title 5 and Education Code. The deadline for new courses and programs, course and program revisions, reactivations and deactivations to be included in the 2017-2018 catalog is the December 08, 2016 CIC meeting. Curriculum proposals for the catalog deadline are due to Curriculum Services on November 18, 2016. Note, although December 08, 2016 is the CIC deadline to have curriculum approved for insertion in the current catalog, courses and programs may require Board of Trustees, state Chancellor's Office and ACCJC/WASC approval prior to the catalog deadline in order to be included in the 2017-2018 catalogs.
