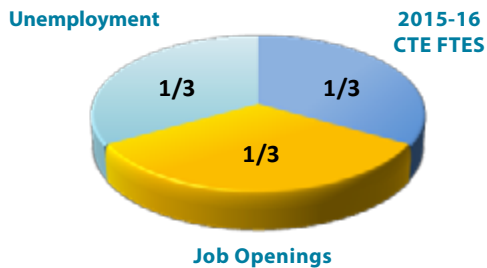

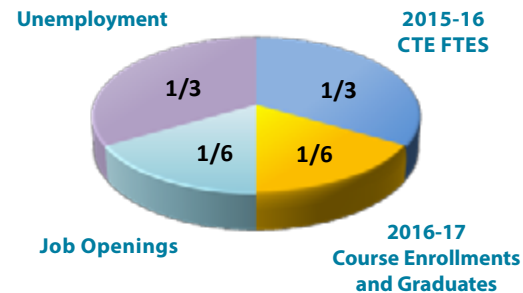
Strong Workforce Program Update

California Legislature made a significant investment in California's community colleges by allocating \$200 million in annual funding for career and technical education (CTE) under the Strong Workforce Program (SWP). The funding was written into the budget through Assembly Bill 1602 as part of an effort to expand and improve CTE programs in California, with a focus on regional collaboration and preparing more students for high-demand and high-wage jobs.

2015-2016 Phase 2 Funding

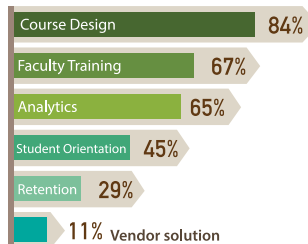

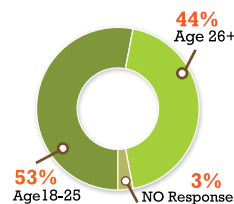

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10 Attributes of Successful Online Students

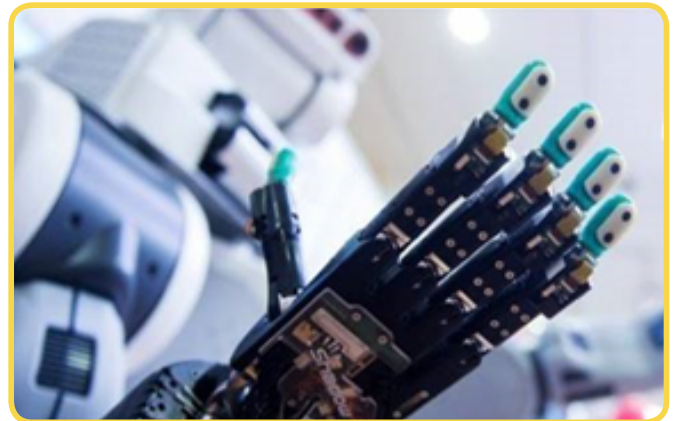
1. They believe in the process: Online students adopt a positive attitude about their school, distance education process, the faculty, and the courses.
2. They speak up: ...students should be aggressive about receiving the support they expect, and clearly communicate the resources they need.
3. They perfect their technical skills.
4. They stay connected: Students should have reliable Internet Service.
5. They know their resources.
6. They find their passion: Students should aim to choose a program that gives their life purpose.
7. They actively participate.
8. They take breaks: Students should engage in coursework in "chunks" of time rather than in long stretches in front of the computer.
9. They schedule their time.
10. They communicate with others.
